Children should continue to read widely over the holiday. They can pick up a book that might challenge them; find a copy of The Week or The Week Junior; pick up a book that they would never normally consider; pick up a classic and see how the language differs from modern literature; read the prequel or the sequel of a book they have enjoyed. Whatever it is, they should enjoy reading for pleasure. They can complete the Book Review template which can be found on Teams, for both sets.
